

## Articles :: How-to Guide to Upload and Download using Secure FTP

ButterJAM recommends using the free software WinSCP ([winscp.net](http://winscp.net)) or FileZilla ([filezilla-project.org](http://filezilla-project.org)) to FTP to your account. Feel free to use any software that you are comfortable in as long as it supports the File Transfer Protocol: SFTP. This guide will use screenshots from WinSCP but the settings will be similar.

Below are the basic settings you need to use. When you have filled it in with your credentials and the settings described below, "Login".

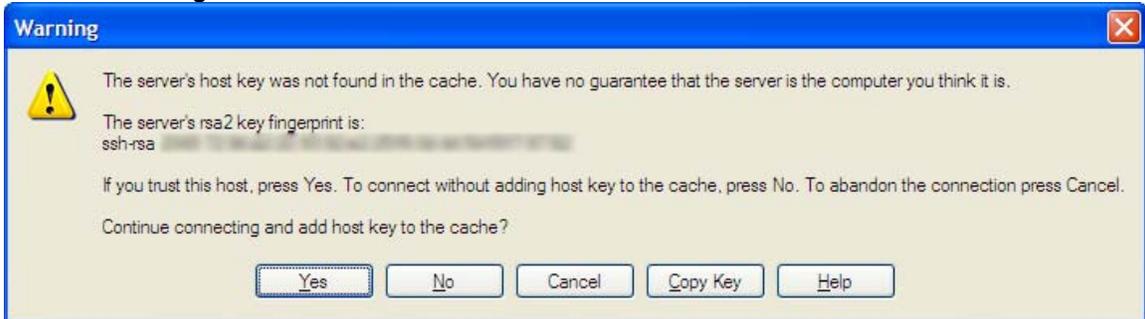
### Basic Settings:

Your FTP program may have a different interface but should have these basic settings and options.

### Potential Warning:

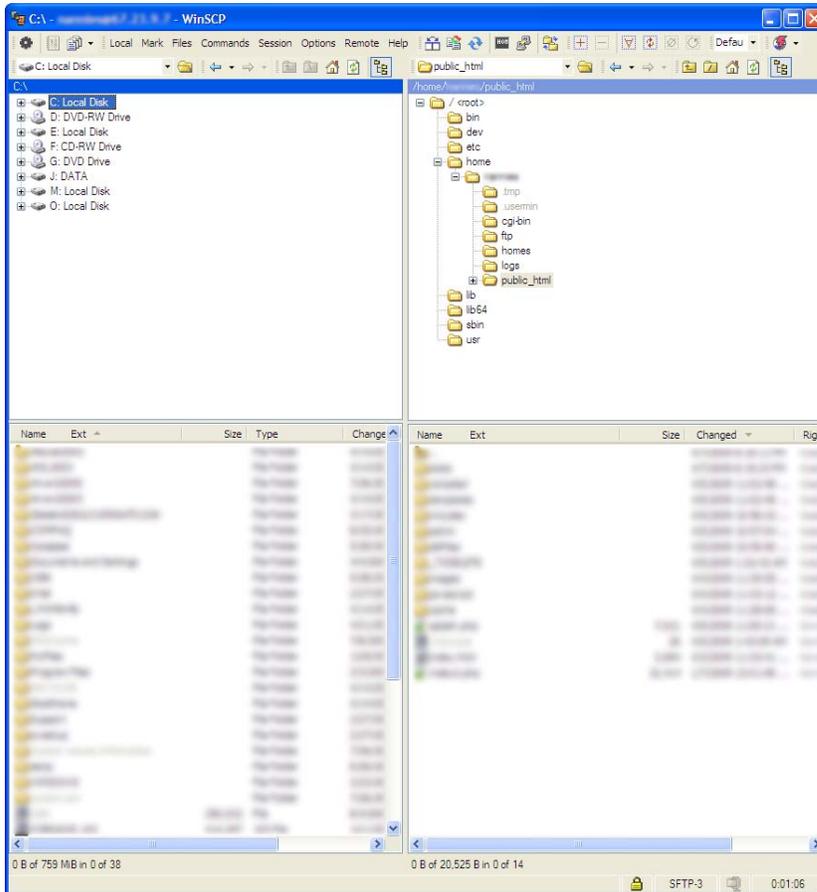


If this is your first time logging in to FTP to your account, you may receive this warning. Say "Yes" to accept.

Once logged in, you will see a lot of folders and files that you may not be familiar with. For all of your website files, you only need to be concerned with the files within the following path: /home/<your username>/public\_html/

### Account File Structure:



All your user files that you upload and download from should be located within:  
/home/<your username>/public\_html/

You are able to create, delete and modify all files and folders within that folder.
